- Ales Bialiatski has been fighting for democracy in Belarus since the 1980s.
- In 1996, he founded the human rights organisation Viasna, which means "spring".

Memorial

- Memorial was founded in 1987 and is the most important human rights organisation in Russia.
- They collect information on victims of the historical Soviet regime and document human rights violations in contemporary Russia.
- The organisation was banned in 2021.







Center for Civil Liberties

- The Center for Civil Liberties was founded in 2007.
- The organisation works to advance human rights and democracy in Ukraine.
- They also document Russia's crimes against the Ukrainian civilian population during the ongoing war.








